## Leading with Compassion in Complex times

### A Note from Tracy

This year reminded us that true progress means deeper impact. Across Napa County, survivors of domestic and sexual violence face increasingly complex barriers to safety—rising living costs, limited housing, and gaps in essential services. Many also carry the weight of uncertainty, fearful to leave their homes in today’s political climate.

While statewide reports of domestic violence have declined, case severity has increased—with more assaults involving weapons. Sonoma County saw 15 domestic violence fatalities in a single year, and recent tragedies here in Napa underscore what’s at stake when safety systems falter.

NEWS continues to meet these challenges head-on. Our advocates spend meaningful time with each survivor, offering trauma-informed care and coordinated support so no one navigates this alone. Every hotline call, court accompaniment, and night of safe shelter is a chance to break the cycle of violence.

This year, we fought funding cuts at the Capitol, walked with 200 community members at Walk-A-Mile Napa Valley, and hosted a conference on stalking awareness. With Leadership Napa

## Healing & Safety Programs

NEWS Advocates are trained in evidence-based support groups for survivors of all ages. Adults benefit from **Seeking Safety**, a program teaching practical coping skills for trauma and/or substance abuse, while children participate in **A Window Between Worlds**, a trauma-informed program using art and play to help them process experiences and build emotional safety.

## Prevention Reach Multiplies Impact

When we teach 1,177 youth about healthy relationships, the ripple effect reaches thousands more—siblings, parents, and peers—amplifying awareness across our community.

## The Hidden Work of Legal Advocacy

**For every hour in court, our advocates spend 5+ hours:**

- Meeting with survivors to review paperwork and the process
- Coordinating with law enforcement and attorneys
- Explaining the court process with survivors
- Navigating language barriers and translation needs
- Arranging safe transportation and childcare for court dates

## The Path to Stability

Survivors need more than a bed—they need tools for long-term independence. Our team provides budgeting support, landlord engagement, rental subsidies, and case management to ensure families don't just leave shelter—they stay safely housed. We work with our clients from months to years to gain their own stability & independence emotionally and physically.

## Did You Know?

Our 24/7 Help Line is answered by trained, bilingual advocates—not automated systems. Every caller speaks with a real person who can help safety plan and immediately connect them to community resources.

# Looking Ahead 2026

In 2026, NEWS will strengthen support for survivors across Napa Valley through focusing on:

**Youth & Healing Programs:** Expanding age-appropriate services for children and teens through school partnerships, peer groups, mentoring, and trauma-informed support. Camp Camino will launch as a summer program combining art, mindfulness, outdoor activities, and peer connection to build resilience.

**Prevention & Outreach:** Educating youth and adults to prevent a crisis through school and community programs, presentations, and awareness campaigns that educate on healthy

relationships, consent, and available resources.

**Accessibility & Staff Excellence:** Providing bilingual services while investing in staff development covering trauma-informed care, cultural competency, and evidence-based interventions.

Through these efforts, NEWS will prevent violence, provide safety, and empower survivors to rebuild their lives with confidence and hope.

### Survivor Stories:

#### *I didn't think I could do it — but now I know I can*

When Maria first visited NEWS, she was quiet and unsure, only inquiring about our programs but not disclosing any form of abuse. Weeks later, she returned with bruises on her face after being assaulted by her partner. NEWS advocates

immediately created a safety plan, walked her through her options. Eventually, Maria decided to file a police report and we were able to secure a protective order, and find emergency shelter for her and her three children.

Over four months, Maria rebuilt her life — NEWS Court Advocates helped Maria with custody, child and spousal support, and eventually a new job and her own apartment. Today, she's confident, hopeful, and excited for what's ahead.

# Camp Camino: Healing Through Joy and Adventure



This summer, NEWS partnered with Leadership Napa Valley to launch Camp Camino—a first-of-its-kind summer camp designed for children impacted by domestic violence and/or sexual abuse.

For five unforgettable days, ten young campers ages 8 - 14 years old explored Napa through adventure, creativity, and connection horses at Sunrise Horse Rescue, shopping at the Napa Farmer's Market and cooking alongside local chef Ken Frank of La Toque, acting at Lucky Penny Productions, creating art at the

di Rosa Center for Contemporary Art, and connecting with nature on hikes and visits to the Parr Nature Museum. Each day offered new opportunities for laughter, learning, and healing in a safe, supportive space.

Thanks to the generosity of local businesses, volunteers, and community partners, Camp Camino was provided completely free of charge.

## Survivor Stories: *A safe place when she needed it most*

Late one Friday night, Leticia reached the NEWS Help Line after escaping to a neighbor's home when her partner became violent. With no family or support nearby, our crisis advocates were able to immediately secure a safe, confidential hotel room through this one call for help.

Leticia had fled with only the clothes on her back, so we provided emergency clothing, food, toiletries, and a temporary phone. Over the weekend, NEWS advocates supported her as she processed the situation and prepared for her adult children to arrive.


Once her children picked her up, we helped her safely retrieve her belongings and transition to a more stable living situation. Weeks later, Leticia shared that she was back at work and living with her daughter — hopeful and grateful for the support that helped her stay safe.
